FINAL EXAMS: As a reminder, all final exams must be taken at TA, in our proctored setting. Students should be working over these next few weeks to make sure that they have:

- complete notes for all classes
- 100% of coursework up to the final completed
- ALL projects, lab reports, essays, and performance tasks done

Final exams will not be opened by the Advisor until each item has been done. Final exams will be held on Monday, Tuesday, & Wednesday, and Thursday (December 16-19). Monday and Wednesday are middle school days for testing and Tuesday and Thursday are high school days, just like our regular school schedule.

Please note: When students are all done with their cumulative exams, they are done for the semester, and will need to be picked up. Thank you!

# \* WINTER ACTIVITY DAYS

Please review the option that best suits your needs and goals and let us know your choice by signing up <a href="HERE">HERE</a> if you have not done so already. As a reminder, these are required school days. Drop off and pick up are at Taos Academy each day.

1) **Skiing/Snowboarding at TSV:** Monday, January 6th - Friday, January 10th. If you have a pass and gear, please simply show up and check in with our TA chaperones when you arrive, during the day, and before you leave. If you need a pass and gear, TSV's school program includes a lift ticket for each of the five days, rental gear, and a mandatory half-day lesson that students must commit to attending each day. Please fill out the needed forms and pay using this link <u>before</u> Dec. 13th: Cost: \$175.

- 2) **Free Ride Option:** If you already have a pass at any other ski area in our region, your own gear, and a responsible adult who will vouch for you, you can also ski or ride at the area of your choice for these three days. Send a picture of your pass to document these days!
- 3). **Snowshoeing**: We have 10 snowshoes available for students, but if you have your own pair, then we can take more students! January 7th (Tuesday) & January 8th (Wednesday) on campus -- these will be the days for students to complete cumulative exams if they had extensions granted by their advisor before the break. January 9th and 10th we will meet at a trailhead (TBD based on weather conditions) for a day of snowshoeing Students will need to dress appropriately and bring lunch!
- 4). **On Campus Rotation:** January 7th (Tuesday) & January 8th (Wednesday) on campus -- these will be the days for students to complete cumulative exams if they had extensions granted by their advisor before the break.

The first day of UNM classes is January 20, 2025.

#### **College and Career Planning Information**

Seniors, please apply to colleges as soon as possible. Deadlines are coming up in December and January.

**Reminder to ask for letters of recommendation ahead of time.** Teachers and staff are happy to write letters for you but please give them as much time as possible and a minimum of 2 business days.

College Entrance Exams - The majority of colleges and scholarships do not require college entrance exams, however, we are seeing some as test optional. In order to take the exams you must register and pay on your own. Taos High School has testing sites for both ACT and SAT. NOTE: 11th graders will be required to take the SATs in the spring, this exam will be held at Taos Academy.
