

Mr. J Weisfeld will hold an orientation meeting in the first week of February for new and continuing internships. If you are continuing the same internship from last year, you will only need March and May progress reports for this semester.

NEW: All new internships must be done with an actual business, sports team, or official organization to receive credit, unless otherwise arranged with Mr. Weisfeld.

If students are interested in starting an internship, they must meet with Mr. Weisfeld to see if they qualify. If they do, they will be invited to the internship classroom and will be given the required paperwork. In order to begin an internship, each student MUST accept the invite and complete the paper forms. Then the student will take photos or scan the complete forms that will be turned in to this classroom as PDF assignments. Paper forms will then be kept by students/families as a record.

No paper forms will be turned in and no emailed forms will be accepted.

Taos Academy's Internship Program gives elective credit to high school students who are volunteering in the community, participating in a sports program, or gaining job experience. In order to receive credit, students must have the business or organization they are working with and parent/guardian fill out these forms and documentation or hours:

- 1. <u>"Memorandum of Understanding"</u>
- 2. "Internship Agreement"

All the above forms must be completed within the first few weeks of each semester and turned in to the Internship Google Classroom as PDFs/photos. All paper forms will be made available by Mr. J Weisfeld. He will meet each semester with interested students and hand out required forms.

All parties must provide their contact information for the form to be considered complete. All hours must be signed off by the official supervisor.
