YEAR END REPORTS: Thank you for your patience while we are completing our grading for the Spring. Student transcripts were mailed out to you in the first week of June.

ALL students, please be sure to review your grades and classes taken for accuracy. Taos Academy policy requires a student to maintain a 2.5 GPA to move on to the next grade level at Taos Academy. Students with a GPA lower than 2.5 or failing core classes may be required to attend an appropriate placement meeting prior to starting the 2020-21 school year, to attend parent/student training sessions, and may be placed on a 5 day a week on-campus Student Success Plan.

<u>High School students</u>, please be sure to look over the transcript carefully for earned credit thus far towards graduation. Taos Academy policy requires HS students to have 24 credits to graduate. If you have revisions or need more information, please give us a call so we can review your records together for accuracy. Reminder: You can check your Career Cruising program to view your individual graduation plan at any time!

College Corner - Dual Credit News -Summer 2021

Juniors: Please register and prepare for your college entrance exams - ACT and/or SAT. EDGE has a good online resource for this. Also please research the colleges that you will be applying to in the future. Please spend this summer visiting colleges (virtually and/or in-person), researching colleges and documenting admission requirements.

(NOTE: Make yourself a spreadsheet with categories that include: University/College names, Financial Aid, Programs of Study, areas of interest, employment outlook, and...most importantly, connect with an advisor at your universities of choice. Get the name w/contact information and this is the person who can assist your transition and requirements as well as transfer credits from your TA/DC transcript.)

Get on board with The BRIDGES Project for Education in Taos. Make an appointment and go meet them. They can be of immense support to your college and scholarship searches.

COLLEGE LINK (CL) is for 11th and 12th graders, who are eligible and interested in

taking college classes during the week M-Th (in addition to Friday College) at UNM. Students must have a 3.0 GPA or better. Participation involves demonstrated commitment to academics and community service as well as maintaining and practicing a balance between school/work/social life.

Friday Early College (FEC) is available to $10^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade students. (2.0-2.5 GPA) This is a UNM – Taos program designed for high school students only. Good for experiential credits as well as some lower division college core classes. It is a full day program on Fridays, and students take a morning class, 9:00 am - 11:30 am and an afternoon college class, 12:00 - 2:30 pm.

Dual Credit (DC) is 3 college credits from UNM – Taos that equals a semester of high school credit (.5 credit). Students must have a 2.5 GPA, or above to be eligible for dual credit core college classes.

INTERNSHIP: Don't forget that your jobs/volunteer hours over the Summer can be credited to internship hours and required credits in this area. (Check with Mr. Weisfeld.)

* May 2021 GRADUATES should request an official final high school TRANSCRIPT from Mrs. Cruz Duran, our Registrar.
