YEAR END REPORTS: Thank you for your patience while we are completing our grading for the Spring. Student transcripts will be mailed out to you in the first week of June.

ALL students, please be sure to review your grades and classes taken for accuracy. Taos Academy policy requires a student to maintain a 2.5 GPA to move on to the next grade level. Students with a GPA lower than 2.5 or failing core classes may be required to attend an appropriate placement meeting prior to starting the next school year, to attend parent/student training sessions, and may be placed on a 5 day a week on-campus Student Success Plan.

<u>High School students</u>, please be sure to look over the transcript carefully for earned credit thus far towards graduation. Taos Academy policy requires HS students to have 24 credits to graduate. If you have revisions or need more information, please give us a call so we can review your records together for accuracy. Reminder: You can check your Career Cruising program to view your individual graduation plan at any time!

Our Community School Focus Group and Needs Assessment was a success. On May 8th a group of 18 participants including students, staff, families, and community partners met for over an hour. During this time they heard about our SEL in Action Project, learned more about our Strategic Plan Initiatives, and conducted a Needs Assessment. The needs assessment involved responding to questions that evaluate how our Community School Initiatives meet the needs of our stakeholders and where we need to improve. This work will help with decision-making for next year's improved implementation of our Community School Initiatives as well as give us information that will help us to create new initiatives to address the needs raised at this Focus Group. We hope to continue these conversations next year with more student and community voices represented in our current decision making structures. - For Sophomores-Class of 2027, Begin prepping for the PSATs to be taken in October 2024. Create a free college board account which connects to Khan Academy where they can build skills based on a practice test. Let the school counselors know how we can support students in prepping for the PSATs.

EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL (ECHS) NEWS

Taos Academy is a designated Early College High School which means we have several ways for students to earn college credit while still in high school. Students can work towards earning an associate degree, or professional certification, completing core college classes, or explore a variety of elective courses. Please check out the options below and be thinking about the ones that might work best for you or your student! College Link (CL)

College Link is an option for 11th and 12th grade students, who are eligible and interested in taking college classes at UNM. <u>Students must have a minimum of a 3.0</u> <u>GPA and a teacher's recommendation to join.</u> Participation involves demonstrated academic integrity and professionalism as well as maintaining and practicing a successful and healthy balance between school, work, and social activities. This option gives our students more freedom and flexibility regarding their time commitment on the TA campus because they balance college, high school, work, sports, etc.

Dual Credit (DC)

All high school students who have a 2.5 GPA or higher can enroll in a college-level course. Students often choose to strategically enroll in classes at UNM that replace their core Edge classes. However, some students also choose to take electives that align with their career or personal goals and interests. Students must still attend Taos Academy all day on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Friday Early College Program (FECP)

This option is available to all eligible students (minimum of 2.5 GPA). This program is designed for high school students only, which is a great option for students' first experience taking college-level classes. Course offerings include experiential credits as well as some lower-division college core classes. It is a full-day program that takes place at UNM Klauer Campus on Fridays. There is a morning session and an afternoon session.

UNM dual credit applications for the Fall semester are due no later than Wednesday, August 9th.

UNM classes for the Fall semester begin on Monday, August 19th.
