SCHOOL STARTS THE WEEK OF:

Monday, August 22nd – Thursday, August 26th School starts at 8am and ends at 4pm

Monday 8/22 - School starts at 8am and concludes at 4pm for ALL middle school students, 5th-8th grades. Students will participate in a full day of orientation activities and begin coursework.

Tuesday 8/23 - School starts at 8am and concludes at 4pm for **7th and 8th graders**; these students will participate in a full day of orientation activities and continue coursework.

School starts at 8 am and concludes at 12 noon for **5th and 6th graders**; 5th and 6th grade students are then dismissed to pack and prepare for their outdoor ed camping activity and will meet at the proposed camping site at 2 pm. Directions, gear list, and site information to come in the August newsletter!

Wednesday 8/24 - School starts at 8 am and concludes at 12 noon for 7th and 8th graders; students are then dismissed to pack and prepare for their outdoor ed camping activity and will meet at the proposed camping site at 2 pm. Directions, gear list, and site information to come in the August newsletter!

5th and 6th graders will be picked up from their outdoor ed camping activity at 1 pm.

Thursday 8/25 - 7th and 8th graders will be picked up from their outdoor ed camping activity at 1 pm.

School starts at 8 am and concludes at 4 pm for 5th and 6th graders.

ALL STUDENTS:

Monday, August 29th – Thursday, September 1st

Beginning the week of August 29th, students will attend TA on their regularly scheduled days. Middle school students attend campus on Monday and Wednesday; high school students attend Tuesday and Thursday from 8 am to 4 pm. College Link will be scheduled around the UNM schedule.

*PLEASE NOTE: September 5th is Labor Day and the school is closed. This week only, Mid School Students will attend Wednesday and Friday.





OTHER ACTIVITIES:

- Mid School Plus Program will be offered from 8-4 Tuesdays and Thursdays, starting August 30th.
- <u>Student Success Lab</u> will be offered from 8-12 Mondays and Wednesdays, starting August 29th.
- <u>Probationary Enrollment:</u> All students with a GPA lower than 2.0, having failed two or more core academic classes and/or not meeting proficiency in any academic area will be placed on <u>probationary enrollment and must attend either MidSchool Plus or HS SSL on their off days.</u> Additional tutoring times and STEM classes may also be part of your child's skills and credit recovery plan.
- <u>STEM+Arts Institute classes</u> will begin the week of August 29th. Schedule TBA. Material fee is \$10 for Middle School and \$20 for High School. Fee payment is required upon sign-up. Scholarships are available.

Hello families. My name is Sara Martinez, I am the 504 Coordinator for the upcoming school year. If you are new to the school, welcome. Please email me a copy of your child's 504 plan if you haven't provided one to the school yet.

Typically, 504s are reviewed annually on the date they were initiated, however you may request to have a review done at the beginning of the school year. If you need a copy of your student's 504 plan let me know. All of your student's teachers will get a copy at the beginning of the year.

For families of students who who have concerns about a physical or mental impairment, please reach out to me.

Each student suspected of having a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities should be evaluated by the district or charter school, on a case-by-case basis, to determine whether they may qualify as having a disability under Section 504.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To be protected under Section 504, a student must be determined to:

- (1) have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; or
- (2) have a record of such an impairment, (i.e., the person has a history of, or has been misclassified as having, a mental or physical impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, even though the person does not currently have a disability); or
- (3) be regarded as having such an impairment, (i.e., the person does not have an impairment but is treated as having an impairment).
