Seniors, **scholarships** begin to open up this semester and the beginning of the first of the next semester. Ms. Vialpando and Mrs. Meagher have been providing you with information about college applications and college entrance exams along with some local scholarships. This takes lots of time and exploration. FAFSA will open December 1 and all college applications should be started by now!

The Spring 2025 UNM-Taos class schedule is available online. Browse your options then schedule a meeting with Miss Pike and Mrs. Meagher to plan and register for your dual credit classes that will begin in January. Remember, check your Career Cruising and transcripts to make sure you find dual credit classes that meet your graduation requirements and also interest you.

Next, if you have not taken a UNM placement assessment for a core class, you need to get this done in order to qualify for Math or English classes at UNM next semester. Reach out to Miss Pike or call UNM student services for the information needed to get this done.

Final progress reports for the fall semester are due the 1st week in December. Please be on the lookout for these deadlines! If a students misses a progress report, they will risk not getting credit or earning a C instead of an A for the Internship credit

For NEW INTERNSHIPS: If students are interested in starting an internship, they must meet with Mr. Weisfeld to see if they qualify. If they do, then they will be invited to the internship classroom and will be given the required paperwork. In order to begin an internship, each student MUST accept the invite and convert all paper forms into digital forms that will be turned into this classroom. Paper forms will then be kept by students as a record. No paper forms will be turned in and no emailed forms are needed.

Taos Academy's Internship Program gives elective credit to high school students who are volunteering in the community, participating in a sports program, or gaining job experience. In order to receive credit, students must have the business or organization they are working with fill out these three forms and documentation or hours:

- 1) The "Memorandum of Understanding" is signed by TA's director and by the business at which the student is interning. This document is an agreement between the school and the business and it protects the business while students are participating in the internship.
- 2) The "Internship Agreement" is a form that details the volunteer, sports, or job opportunity. It must be signed by the student, mentor, coach or job supervisor, the coordinator of the TA Internship Program, the parent, and TA's director.
- 3) The Progress Reports are dated and must be completed by the supervising party-2 for each semester of internship credit-and must include a supervisor signature (digital signatures and initials. It is ok if the supervisor is a parent or a member of the TA community) and total hours.
- Both progress reports turned in on time = A grade
- Only one progress report on time = C grade
- No progress report = No credit

All the above forms must be completed within the first few weeks of each semester and turned into the Internship Google Classroom. All parties must provide their contact information for the form to be considered complete.
