

Taos Academy's Internship Program gives elective credit to high school students who are volunteering for an organization, gaining job experience or getting mentored. In order to receive credit, students must work for a certified business or official organization.

October progress reports are DUE OCTOBER 11 and are posted in the Internship classroom. October progress reports are due and will not be accepted after Oct 11, 2024.

Any new student that would like to do an internship for elective credit, must first meet with Mr. J Weisfeld to get a short training on how to complete forms in the internship google classroom. They will then be invited into the classroom. These following forms will then be posted in the classroom as assignments with due dates that students must print (or get a printed copy from Mr. J), get completed in pen, photographed on time and submitted into the classroom in the proper place.

- 1. "Memorandum of Understanding"
- 2. "Internship Agreement"
- 3. <u>Summer</u>, Fall (<u>October</u> and <u>December</u>), Spring (<u>March</u> and <u>May</u>) progress reports (1 for summer, 2 per fall and spring semester)

The "Memorandum of Understanding" is signed by TA's director and by the business at which the student is interning. This document is an agreement between the school and the business and it protects the business while students are participating in the internship.

The "Internship Agreement" is a form that details the volunteer, sports, or job opportunity. It must be signed by the student, mentor, coach or job supervisor, the coordinator of the TA Internship Program, the parent, and TA's director.

The Progress Reports are dated and must be completed by the supervising party-2 for each semester of internship credit-and must include a supervisor signature. All forms must be complete in order to receive credit.
