**Tuesday 8/15** - School starts at 8am and concludes at 4pm for High School Only this week. Students will participate in orientation activities and begin coursework. (CL Juniors only; sign up for 3 CL labs.)

Wednesday 8/16 - This is a TENTATIVE schedule and subject to change. Schedule will be confirmed in the August newsletter.

#### MS SCHOOL STARTS THE WEEK OF:

# Monday, August 21st – Thursday, 24th School starts at 8am and ends at 4pm

Monday 8/21: School starts at 8am and concludes at 4pm for ALL middle school students, 5th-8th grades. Students will participate in a full day of orientation activities and begin coursework.

**Tuesday 8/22:** All middle school students on campus at 8 am. 5th and 6th graders will be dismissed at 12 noon for their outdoor leadership activities and overnight camping trip. 7th and 8th graders will remain on campus for the day to continue orientation until 4 pm.

**Wednesday 8/23:** 5th and 6th graders will continue on their outdoor leadership trip. Pickup and location TBA. 7th and 8th graders will be dismissed at 12 noon for their outdoor leadership activities and overnight camping trip.

**Thursday 8/24:** 7th and 8th graders will continue on their outdoor leadership trip. Pickup and location TBA. 5th and 6th graders will return to TA campus for the remainder of their orientation week from 8 am til 4 pm.



Please note: Families will be responsible for transportation to and from camping sites. In addition to the items on their gear list, students will need a sack lunch.

# Monday, August 28th - Thursday, August 31st

Beginning the week of August 28<sup>th</sup>, students will attend TA on their regularly scheduled days. Middle school students attend campus on Monday and Wednesday; high school students attend Tuesday and Thursday from 8 am to 4 pm. College Link will be scheduled around the UNM schedule.

\*PLEASE NOTE: September 4th is Labor Day and the school is closed. This week only, middle school students will attend Wednesday 9/6 and Friday 9/8.

#### **OTHER ACTIVITIES:**

• <u>Mid School Plus Program</u> will be offered from 8-4 Tuesdays and Thursdays, starting Tuesday, August 29th.

- <u>Student Success Lab</u> will be offered from 8-12 Mondays and Wednesdays, starting Monday, August 28th.
- <u>Probationary Enrollment:</u> Per TA policy and in the purposes of academic excellence

All students with a GPA lower than 2.0, having failed two or more core academic classes and/or not meeting proficiency in any academic area will be placed on probationary enrollment and must attend either MidSchool Plus or HS SSL on their off days. Students and families should plan for them to be on campus from 8 am to 4 pm in addition to all Fridays from 8 am to 1:30 pm.

Additional tutoring times and STEM classes may also be part of your child's skills and credit recovery plan. You will receive an email and phone call from your child's adviser to begin their Student Success Plan, which runs all semester.

• <u>STEM+Arts Institute classes</u> will begin the week of August 28th. Schedule TBA. Material fee is \$10 for Middle School and \$20 for High School. Fee payment is required upon sign-up. Scholarships are available.

There will be a special focus on equity and student voice in all of our meetings as we want to meet the needs of all of our students and families in a culturally and linguistically responsive manner. If you don't want to attend SBLT

meetings in person or virtually and would prefer to help with activities and events supporting the Taos Technology Center and TA Community School, please let us know what you want to help with. We have many activities and events to choose from. Sign ups for participating will be available for events and activities at the start of the school year.
